Narrative:

Mr. Twohy is the son of and next of kin to Mr. Timothy Twohy, the pilot of a Cessna 172 that went missing on March 6, 2019 and was found on July 22, 2019. This is a summary of his statements that were made on a telephone interview before the airplane was found.

- Mr. Twohy lives with his uncle, Steven Twohy, and is the next of kin to Mr. Timothy Twohy.
- His father lives in Wasilla by himself. Mr. Twohy (Jr.) has no knowledge of medical conditions or life events that would have affected his father's medical readiness. He last spoke with his father the day before the airplane went missing and he was good.
- The airplane was kept at a tie down at Wasilla Airport. Mr. Twohy did not know who maintained the airplane or where the logbooks were, although they had been searching for them and believe they may have been on the airplane.
- The pilot logbooks may be in his father's house. His father flew very regularly in the Summer, but not very much in the Winter.
- Mr. Twohy related that about 6 years prior, his father flew to Minnesota and had a carbon monoxide problem that had to be fixed there. He now flies with carbon monoxide detector. He heard rumors about his father acting strange on the day he went missing due to possible CO poisoning, but he does not believe that was the case. He believes that it may have been a dispute with someone who misunderstood him.
