1. EVENT

2. GROUP

A video group was not convened.

3. DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION

The National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) Vehicle Recorder Division received a video file from a security camera system. The video files were downloaded and forwarded via a file share service to the NTSB.

3.1. Video File Information

The video file was given to the NTSB Vehicle Recorder Division as a proprietary security camera playback executable. Screen capture software was used to convert the video to a commercial-off-the-shelf format. The video file is 10 minutes and one second long.

3.2. Time Correlation

The timestamp at the beginning of the video indicates a starting time of 4:20:01. This time stamp is unverifiable and therefore will not be used. Instead, time will be given in video elapsed time in the format mm:ss where mm is time in minutes and ss is time in seconds.

4. Summary of Recorded Events

In agreement with the Investigator-in-Charge, a video group was not convened. Instead, video pertinent to the event was reviewed and summarized.

Figure 1 shows the framing of the security camera video. The train is visible in the distant clearing between two wooded areas and indicated with a red arrow.

At 03:29 the event train came into view. The train was moving right to left in the frame and is very far from the camera.

At 04:38 the train came to a stop.

At 05:20 the train began to move again.

At 06:35 the train stopped again.

The train did not move for the remainder of the video. The video ended at 10:01 elapsed.

Due to the distance of the camera from the train, at no time were the movements of the struck crew member visible.
