I was on the fairway of Hole B which runs adjacent to the runway. My playing partner noticed the plane touching down. At that moment I turned around and noticed the plane ~~attempting~~ attempting to take flight again. Instead of heading down the runway the plane veered off towards the golf course quickly. It looked like it was trying to fly a lot higher than what the speed accounted for. The plane had issues keeping steady and by the time it was flying over our heads on 13 (which was about 7-10 seconds after lift off) the plane was turned entirely on its left side, it was still low enough where I could make out letters on the sides of the plane. The pilot was then able to level out the plane by the time it reached near the tee boxes of 13 the plane ~~was~~ began to turn left + towards the green of 14. The plane still was struggling to maintain altitude. And it was ~~bobbing~~ bobbing up and down, it began to turn toward 17 (for what I thought would be an emergency landing). The plane turned on its left side again and nosedived towards where the cart path of 16 meets 17.

I could hear ~~the~~ noises when the plane was above me, but I don't recall hearing noises (as in the engine) in the plane before it crashed. Two seconds later after the plane diving behind the trees, I heard a small explosion. I drove to the tee box of 16 and my friend Anthony Locascio who was also interviewed, left the cart and walked near the crash from 17. I proceeded down the cartpath of 16 till where I saw flames emerging which covered about a third of the front portion of the plane. I heard people yelling at me from 17 to "back away" & "get out of there". I could hear cries for help as I backed my cart up. This had all transpired within under 3 minutes.

Around 3pm on July 7, 2019 a small, single engine aircraft could be seen from the 18th tee box (my point of view) struggling (in my opinion) to gain altitude. The plane was trying to gain altitude and started to turn to come back down the 17th fairway. As the plane started to turn towards the 17th fairway it just fell out of the sky. There were some very strong winds and from what I could see it seemed like the plane was pushed down (out of the sky) by the wind. As soon as the plane crashed to the ground, I took off running towards it. When I got to the crash, myself and some ~~people~~ other people tried to pull the pilot from the crash. We tried everything in our power to get the pilot free from the crash. On our third attempt that is when the firefighters arrived and were able to get the pilot freed from the crash. The paramedics/EMS arrived and treated the pilot and then airlifted her in the helicopter. After the helicopter left, myself and a few others talked with paramedics and they cleared us and we left.

Just after 3pm Will Crisanti and I were finishing up on the 17th green. I got Will's attention and pointed at the plane as it was taking off into the wind towards Molly Barr Road.

The engine was loud, plane at a sharp angle, + was obviously struggling. A few seconds later I looked to the 17th tee box to see the plane making a turn over the tree line in between 16 green + 17 tee box. I ran to the cart, grabbed my phone, and called 911 as we began running. When we got to the plane (about 300 yards) I believe I was the 3rd to arrive. Sam, Will, and I made attempts to pull the pilots arms but we were unsuccessful.

We retreated back to the tee box. I explained to them that the fuel was likely in the wings and it could blow any minute.

Will and I made another attempt to pull but again were unsuccessful.

That would be my last time up to the plane I believe. I could not see anything holding the pilot or pinning the pilot while we were up there by the plane. Before 1st responders arrived there was one small explosion on the right side of the cockpit/wing. Vantage point was from the tail of the plane. Her body was burning from the waist down and she called out for help repeatedly. I do not remember  if she was still screaming when the 1st Fire Department member arrived. The last thing I heard the pilot scream was "God help me."

We waited on scene for the next hour or so before being picked up and taken home.

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

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

Alex and I had finished up hole #13 and there was a long line in front of us so we skipped onto the 16th tee box. When I was teeing off, the plane was a couple hundred feet above us very wobbly, did not seem like she had control of the plane we lost vision of her as she went behind the trees on the right of 16. My friend Alex ~~then~~ told me he believed she was going to crash. About 30 seconds later we heard the crash and hopped in the car and drove to the plane. I called 9-1-1 they told me they were already in progress. Alex and I ran down, I was scared the plane was going to explode so I never got to close. A few brave men tried pulling her out.

her out. We saw a fire extinguisher to her but it
was not powerful enough. She was screaming for 5
mins and we didn't have a knife. A firefighter ran
down and got her out and the rest of the Department
got here after that.


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

Persons Present: We were in the cart headed to hole 17 tee box and we noticed a plane flying low and seemed like she was losing control of the plane. She crashed right in front of us (15-20 yds) we called 911 and ran down to help her. We couldn't get her out because the seatbelt was fastened. Someone found some scissors and I went back to the plane to cut the belt while my partner pulled her arms, but by that time the flames had engulfed the plane and it was too hot.

I first heard the plane on take off or very close to the runway. The first visual I had of the plane was barely above the trees over hole 16. The plane appeared to be struggling to maintain airspeed and was nose up. The plane appeared to be very close to stalling. The plane then made a hard left turn and lost altitude. I thought the plane was going for a landing on #17 fairway. The plane continued with a left turn and struck the ground and slid up to the trees. I ran to the plane and saw the pilot with her head and shoulders laying out of the left door area. The door was already off when I reached the plane and I was the 1st or 2nd person to reach the plane. It struck the ground about 75-100 ft from where we were parked. I thought the pilot was killed on impact due to her not moving and bleeding from the head. Me and Sam Couse began trying to pull her from the plane because the ~~engine~~^{engine} caught fire by the time it came to rest. Fire was small but in the cockpit while we tried to pull her out. The safety belt was on and we couldn't reach in to release it. At this point the pilot was regaining consciousness. The fire got more intense and we had to leave the plane. The pilot was begging/screaming for help but the fire was too intense. A few others tried but couldn't get her out. She was still screaming for help when the left jet wing above the door burnt off and fell down on her abdomen. After a few minutes she went silent. The fire was too hot for anyone to release her even though she was hanging out of the door.
