- Alex submitted an email message and video footage to the NTSB eyewitness email account (eyewitness@ntsb.gov).1
- Alex lives in Jamul, CA.
- Alex observed the airplane. He initially heard the airplane flying overhead at his residence. He observed the airplane around noon local time. Alex heard the engine power, going up and down. He retrieved a set of binoculars to observe the airplane. Once he got his eyes on the airplane with the binoculars, he was able to watch it for a few minutes as it was north of his position. The airplane then began a south-west turn away from his viewing location, and eventually went out of visual range for him. During the period he had his eyes on the airplane, the engine power seemed to be going back and forth. He did not observe any fire, smoke, or debris emit from the airplane.

#### Good morning,

On Monday, October 11 I heard an airplane engine overhead which is not unusual. I live north of Jamul in a direct line south of Alpine California 6 miles. The sound of the engines going up and down in power let me outside because it was inconsistent with aircraft and platforms we see out here all the time. I actually went and got binoculars and was able to visually watch the aircraft for a few minutes it was north of my position and then began a south west turned out of my position and out of visual range. Many times throughout the 2 to 3 minutes that I observed this aircraft, the throttle was going back-and-forth in a manner not consistent with normal operation. That's all I have to report.



Bryan could not tell if there was a mechanical issue with the airplane or not. When the airplane impacted the ground, there was a loud boom.

The noise was a very high-rpm type noise. He felt the impact shock inside of his home after the airplane impacted terrain. Cody used to work on turboprop airplanes in the U.S. Navy, and he surmised the noise from the airplane sounded like a single engine propeller airplane, and not a dual engine propeller airplane.

My name is Melinda Gibson and I believe I may have seen the plane seconds before it crashed.

I was walking my dog at approximately 12:15pm and noticed a white Cessna type aircraft in the sky. It caught my eye because I usually don't see planes flying south and that low in my neighborhood. The wings were tilted like it was trying to turn as it was heading south. Unfortunately I didn't hear anything since the neighborhood trees were getting trimmed and all I could hear was a chain saw.

Moments later I saw a huge plume of black smoke, I am within a mile of the crash site.

If this was the plane that crashed it may have spiraled downward due to proximity to the crash site

and where I last saw it in the sky.
