





Witnesses reported seeing the plane flying low over the water before plunging into the ocean between Cape May and Cape May Point.

John Achzet, from Elkton, Maryland, said it appeared the plane may have struck the water before it surged up and crashed back into the ocean.

"My wife and I were sitting here and we saw a plane maybe 75 yards off shore flying very low from Cape May flying low to the water, maybe 3 feet," Achzet said. "It hit a little swell in the water, went about 50 yards in the air, went straight down and then it was gone."
