AMENDMENT 6 TO CAPTAIN OF THE PORT ORDER: 7091023

To Master, Owner, Agent, or Person in Charge:

On February 22, 2022, Coast Guard Sector Miami Port State Control Branch received the results of the dead ship tow survey attesting to the seaworthiness of the vessel. Your vessel is hereby authorized to depart to sea utilizing the accepted tow plan. Considering the history of the vessel's hazardous safety, security and environmental conditions as addressed in previous Captain of the Port Orders, the following are conditions for reentry:

- Completion of a security audit by the Flag State Administration or Recognized Security Organization on its behalf, with a report presented to this office for review and concurrence prior to the vessel's next arrival to United States waters;
- Submission of a Flag State Administration or a Coast Guard approved Classification Society report addressing all repairs completed in the United States. You may provide
- a Letter of Undertaking (LOU) in lieu of the aforementioned Flag State Administration or Coast Guard-approved Classification Society report;
- Completion of a satisfactory Port State Control exam to outside of United States territorial seas (or 12 nautical miles).

You must submit the survey and audit results to our office for review prior to authorization to proceed into United States waters. You must receive a written response from this office before your vessel is cleared for any operations.

Under 46 U.S.C. § 70036, failure to comply with this Captain of the Port Order may subject you to penalties including: (1) a civil penalty of \$103,050 for each violation; or (2) imprisonment for up to 6 years, a \$500,000 fine, or both. I am issuing this Captain of the Port Order without prejudice as to the initiation of civil penalty proceedings for any violations that may have previously occurred.
