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In the statement on the 2692, Jeff says at 1500 he decided to leave the vessel and let it sink (abo don the tow). The office notified USCG reporting it as sinking or going to sink (this may be the source of confusion). The sinking wasn't immediate, but took some time. In his statement he cites the same time 1500 he would abandon the tow.

They vessel officially sank (completely submerged and below the surface of the water) at 1620.

I'm wondering what time the Carib Trader II actually sank:

- **1520** [logbook]
- **1530** [time National Response Center logged the vessel manager called reporting the Carib Trader sank]
- **1620** [Capt & Chief Engineer written statements]
- Time of sinking not in CG-2692

The vessel time should have been EST, as Haiti is in the same time zone as Miami, FL (-5hrs UTC).

RFI:

- **Please ask the captain which time the Carib Trader II sank is correct – at 1520 per the logbook or at 1620 per his statement?**
- **Please email me copy of the captain's night orders for 3/3, 3/4, 3/5, and 3/6/2022.**
